Hadfield Trust The Hadfield Trust awards grants of up to £5,000 and exists to support community projects that meet the needs and make a real difference to the quality of life of those living in Cumbria.	Priority areas of the Trust: • Social needs • Youth and employment • Help for older people • The arts • The environment

Holiday Activities and Food Programme (Westmorland & Furness Council) Providing fully funded activities and meals during the school holidays for eligible children and young people. HAF provides a safe and welcoming environment that includes healthy meals, enriching activities, physical exercise and basic nutritional education. Providers use our booking system which is designed to make the process much easier. To check eligibility, manage bookings, monitor attendance and to promote their programme.	We fund and support organisations to deliver the HAF programmes for eligible children and young people; primarily targeted at school aged children (Reception to Yr11 who receive benefits-related free school meals). Other groups such as young carers, care experienced, SEND or on an EHCP, home educated or a young person on resettlement schemes or seeking asylum are also eligible. To any organisations already delivering a holiday programme. We would explore purchasing places for children and young people who are eligible for HAF.

The National Lottery Community Fund Funds projects that support people and communities across the UK, with a focus on ideas that bring people together, improve community spaces and help people reach their potential.	Support for: • Capital costs • Staff and running costs • Activities and equipment • Other core costs <u>Funding rounds:</u> National Lottery award for all (grants from £300 to £20,000 for up to 2 years) = one stage application process - apply at any time. Reaching Communities (grants from £20,001) = 2 stage application process. Open access for both.

The National Lottery Heritage Fund Using money raised by National Lottery players, we distribute grants from £10,000 to £10million to support projects across the UK that connect people and communities to their heritage.	Heritage can be anything from the past that you value and want to pass on to future generations. Understanding, valuing and sharing our heritage brings people together, inspires pride in place and supports local economies.
